** CHARACTER CREATION NIGHT **

On Stardate 46090.4 I arrived at the residence of Commander Henline for the purpose of teaching the members of the Kelly about creating characters for the Star Trek Role Playing Game. When I had arrived I discovered that a presentation introducing us to the Pleasant Grove Educational Simulator had been set up previous to my arrival.

After the ships business and announcements concluded we viewed slides of the simulator and listened to a lecture on the history and development of the simulator. Ideas were requested on improving the simulator not only education wise but making it suitable for use by a more adult audience.

Shortly afterward I began my presentation for character creation. Character sheets that I had designed and complete skill lists were handed out to the crew in attendance. The first part of the presentation included descriptions of role playing, the use of dice and the character sheet that had been handed out. The second part consisted of the actual dice rolling needed to create the attributes and skills of the character.

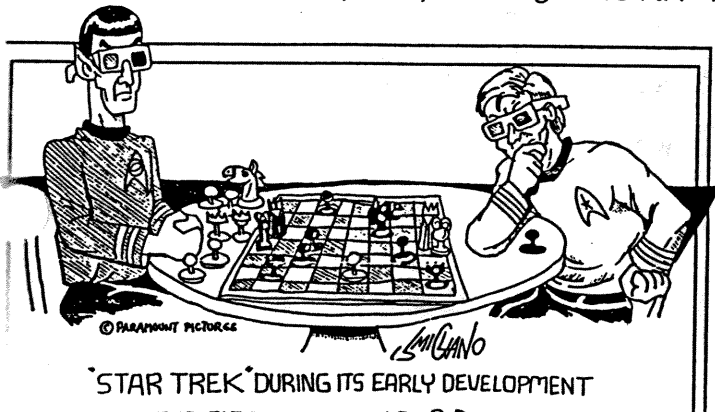
At this time the crew had the opportunity to choose what race there character would be. Knowing that Lt. Millman was an Alasamorph ahead of time made it easier to prepare for helping him with his character. As expected some members wanted to be one of the races not given on the list of the nine most common members of Starfleet during our day. Request to become a member of the Q or a 1/2Q were quickly denied. However Lt. Burns request to be a mixture of Human, Deltan, & Betazoid caught me by surprise.

Next all members choose their skills that they had learned before they attended the Academy. Afterwards basic academy courses and branch skills were added to the character sheet. For enlisted personnel their creation process consisted of the recruit training, technical school, & branch specialty school.

The majority of members had to depart at this time due to the late hour. I helped those who had stayed with the rest of their creation process which included command school, department head school, the cadet cruise and any tours that their character may have had before joining the Kelly. Few people completed their characters. Therefore if anyone wishes to complete their character they may contact me and I will be willing to get with them to finish anything that needs to be done.

Over all I believe that the class was a nominal success in introducing the Star Trek Role Playing Game to the group. The only major disappointment was the fact that I could not run the short scenario put together by Lt. Rouviere and myself. However I was pleased that one of the regular members of the game, Ensign Wessman, was able to tell one of here most memorable experiences of the current campaign. LT. (j.g.) Carl Stark has asked about the symbol of the Enterprise and its evolution. At the time of the construction of the Starship Enterprise, each individual starship has its own unique symbol. The Enterprise's insignia was no doubt chosen by its first Captain, Robert T. April. Why he chose that particular design has never been explained. In reality, the symbol was a creation of Gene Roddenberry or one of his production designers, but the significance of the insignia has not been explained by them either.

The shape was derived from the fourth letter of the Greek alphabet, known as the Delta. Picture an isosceles triangle with the point going upward and forward. Perhaps this symbolizes the Enterprise "boldly going where no man has gone before," and maybe that is why the Delta shape was chosen.

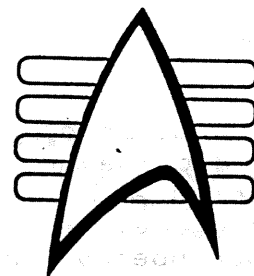
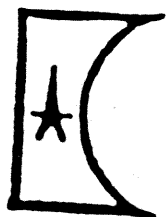
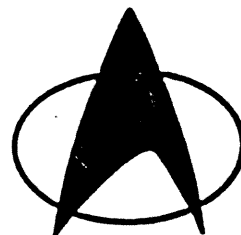
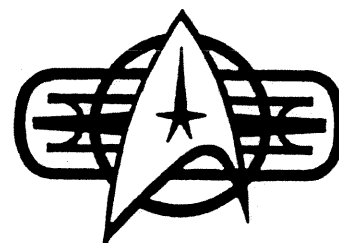
In honor of the Enterprise and its incredibly successful mission, Starfleet Command adopted the Enterprise insignia, adding the oval shield, for its own symbol.

By the time of the Next Generation, personal communicators for Starfleet personnel were made in the same shape. In the episode "Future Imperfect," supposedly eleven years in the Next Generation's future, bars are added to denote the rank of the wearer.

From such humble beginnings, the symbol has become universally recognized. It has become an integral part of the world of Star Trek. In real life, a person wearing this symbol is immediately known to be a part of the Star Trek phenomenon. People from all walks of life identify this shape with Capt. James T. Kirk, or Jean-Luc Picard, or with the famous Starship Enterprise.

Though less well-known, the insignia of the U.S.S. Kelly has undergone an evolution of its own. We have had many comments on its appearance and originality. We hope that as more people learn about the Kelly, its symbol will also become recognizable as a part of the Star Trek universe.

Denver Starcon "92". Sunday, September 27th. Brent Spiner on stage. Brent appears dressed in blue jeans, reeboks, white t-shirt and a black jacket. Cameras flash continuously for at least thirty minutes, then slowing down, but never really stopping. Many people of all ages and walks of life are lined up on either side of the stage to ask questions.

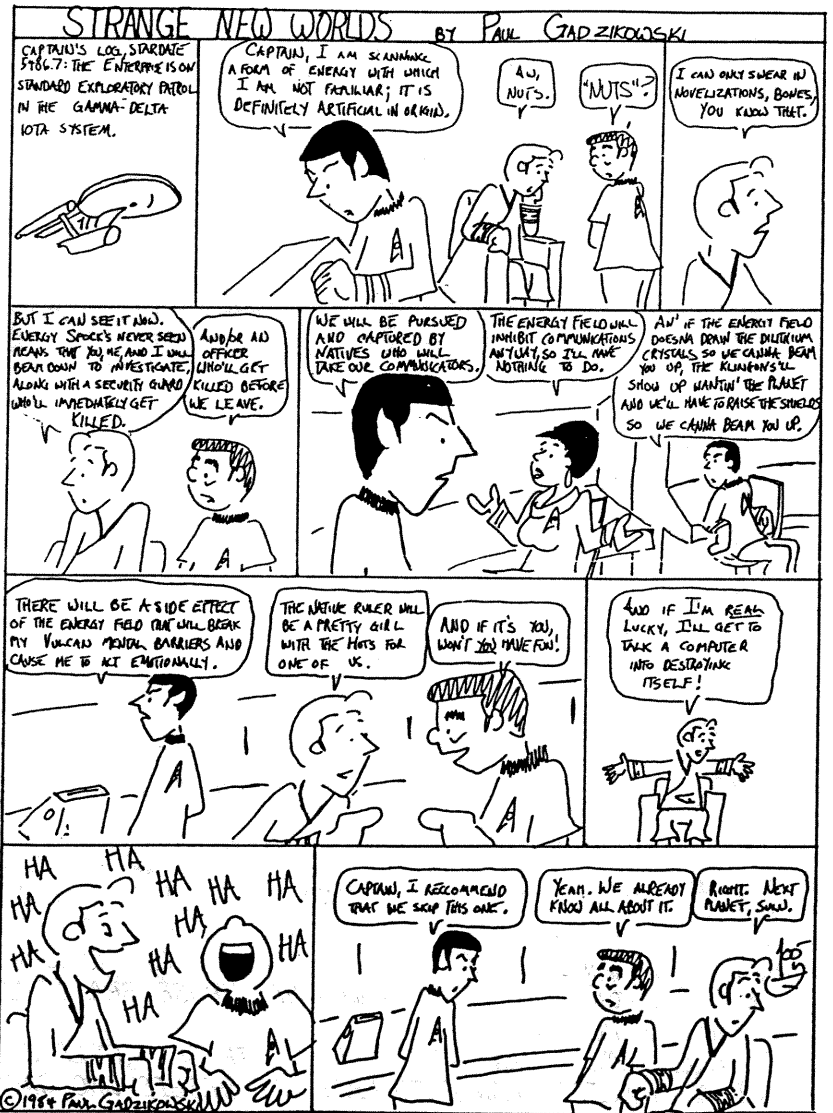

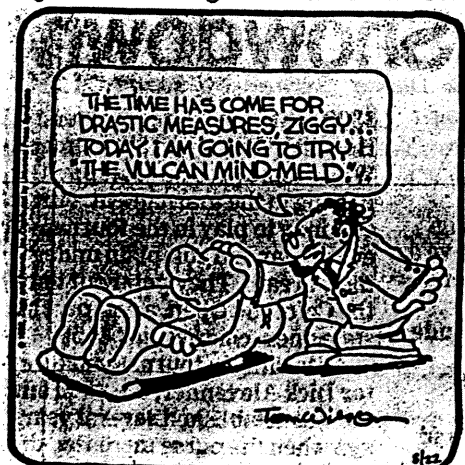

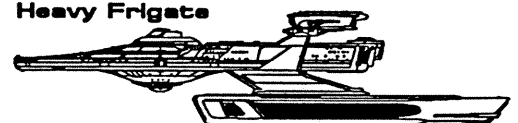

Data's head, the future, found in the past! You can do the same thing. Discover the future in a store full of the past! Star Trek and antiques are two hobbies which may appear to be incongruent. However I find antique stores to be a wonderful source for the reasonably priced, offbeat Star Trek trivia items. These items, metal lunch boxes, pins, comic books, studio photos, promo trinkets, etc. usually aren't even available at conventions or in current catalogs. Here are some collectibles I found this past weekend (Aug. 22nd) at the Silver Queen Antique Co-Op #33 Main Street in Park City. This store, as well as many antique stores, has a section just for Star Trek memorabilia! (Be sure to ask for assistance or you may miss some Trek on special display elsewhere in the store.) All items I found were in "mint" condition, most of them in their ORIGINAL PACKAGING! Even if you aren't interested in the purchases for yourself, think of the possibilities to sell some of it and make a nice profit.

Items found:

1. 1966 Star Trek Mirror. Signed Paramount Pictures Corp. dated 1966 B&W original crew picture on the flip side. About the size of a wallet picture. In original package \$8.00

2. 1979 perfect condition Star Trek TMP a Marvel Super Special Magazine-The official comics adaptation of the film with photos, features, interviews, art, and a new concordance. \$12.00

3. Star Trek Tokens, plastic, various colors, about the size of a quarter. Sold as a set featuring the pictures of Spock, Kirk, McCoy, Scott, Jhura, and Chekov. \$7.00 In good shape but no original wrapping.

4. 1976 Star Trek Slide Puzzle. Plastic blocks with a picture of the original crew and the words "Unscramble the Crew" on the top of the puzzle and the words "Star Trek" at the base. \$6.50 in the original package unused.

5. 1979 Star Trek Putty (like silly putty) in the original package including a tube of "Transfer (as in beaming) Solution" from ST:TMP \$11.00

6. Starlog #64 (a science fiction magazine) A Star Trek review by David Gerrold with Star Trek Special Effects Explained in the edition. \$7.00 This item looked a little worn. (several back issues of this magazine and their comics of SF nature are available)

7. Star Trek Pin black button Star Trek V. Navy square pin with lighter blue writing (top line "Star Trek V" bottom line "The Final Frontier"). \$4.00 *note: This item is fairly recent and may still be available in catalogs but this way you don't pay the usual three dollars shipping and save 6-8 weeks waiting for the mail.

Most antique dealers are willing to lower prices if they've had an item a while or if you're buying more than one thing.

For those of you also interested in other SF. I found: many old Buck Rodgers pins and books, Close Encounters Special Ed. comic book and a Close Encounter of the third kind post card book for \$28.00. I didn't see any Star Wars this time but have lots of the past.

Anyway this was all I found in literally about 15 minutes before my husband "knew" the rest of the vacation would be in that store if we didn't leave for lunch, but you can see the future's there waiting for you.

I do not know about you but I find it very difficult to tolerate computer food all the time. So for those of you who like a real challenge let me share a couple of recipes from my collection.

Scrambled Eggs A La Regulus

4 fresh Regular Eel-Bird eggs.
 1/4 teaspoon of Orion Salt
 1/4 teaspoon of freshly grounded Organian pepper
 1 Cup of Antarean Brandy
 2 tablespoons of Rigellian oil

Combine the eggs, Orion Salt, Organian pepper and Antarean Brandy into a bowl. Beat moderately with a whisk until the yolks and whites of eggs are well blended. Heat the oil in a skillet and when sizzling, add egg mixture. Lower heat. Stir gently and continuously until smooth and creamy.

Shoppers trek in to snatch up ornaments

Demand's out of this world for Hallmark's talking model of the Galileo shuttlecraft.

When last seen at the end of "Star Trek VI," the original crew of the USS Enterprise was sailing off among the stars.

But this fall one crew member has returned to Earth at the helm of what could be one of the season's hottest Christmas ornaments.

Hallmark dealers across the country are tickled at the prospect

of another mega-hit.

The shuttlecraft Galileo, second in Hallmark Cards' line of ornaments from the popular television series, began arriving in stores recently. Sales already are impressive.

"We had a long waiting list, and those people have already come in and gotten theirs," says Rita Panter, manager of a Hallmark in Birmingham, Ala. "Some stores had waiting lists of 200 people or more. Our list was only about 95, but that's still a lot."

Sign-up lists were indeed started this summer. Many signed up to avoid getting caught short, a com-

mon occurrence last Christmas.

The \$24 ornament is a 3-inch-long model of the shuttlecraft featured in several episodes of the classic TV series. It includes flashing lights and a recorded greeting from Mr. Spock, the Enterprise's chief science officer and a Starfleet diplomat.

At the push of a button, the message plays, "Spock to Enterprise: Season's greetings. Live long and prosper."

Leonard Nimoy, who portrayed the character in the series and films, recorded the message and also appears in television commercials promoting the ornaments.

Last year's ornament, a model of

the Enterprise, was one of the most popular Christmas items ever for Hallmark. The company was unable to produce enough to fill retail orders.

The ornament, which retailed last fall for \$20, has been fetching up to \$200 at "Star Trek" conventions this summer.

"We did learn from last year's popularity. So we produced a large quantity of the ornaments this year," Hallmark spokeswoman Donna Garland said. "On the other hand, we like to pay attention to our collectors, and they rely on us not to flood the market with too many of a particular ornament, so we won't do that."

The ornament was shipped first to larger accounts and will be phased into all Hallmark outlets through September and October.
