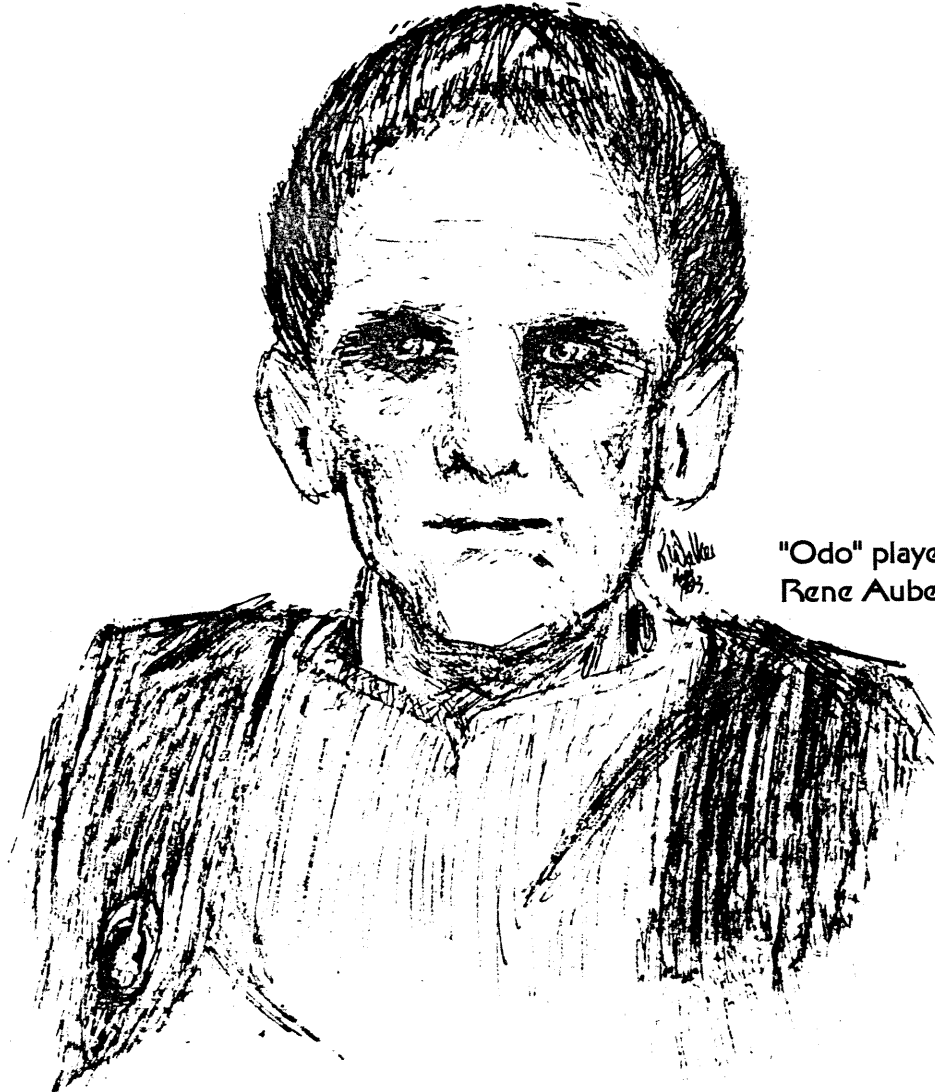

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ASK NUMBER ONE

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I have people at my work who like to discuss Star Trek with me. They always have a lot of comments or questions for me about the most recent episode. A few weeks ago, after watching the Deep Space Nine episode "Get on along Home", one of my friends asked me how a new race from the Gamma Quadrant meeting the Federation officials for the first time, could speak and understand English.

To be precise, they were not speaking or understanding English. The language used in the Star Trek universe is known as Federation standard or simply standard. For the benefit of the actors and the television viewing public, it is heard on our television sets as English. It was necessary to standardize their language. Otherwise, Major Kira would speak Bajoran, Jean-Luc Picard would speak French, Worf Klingonese, and Uhura Swahili along with others, speaking approximately twenty-five hundred other languages from the known races of the galaxy.

For those who have not yet had time to learn Federation standard, like our new friends from the Gamma quadrant, Federation technology has provided a device known as the Universal Translator. To put it simply, the Universal Translator is a decoding device. When a new language is spoken into the translator, its integrated micro-computer analyzes the speech pattern, identifies certain sounds with corresponding meanings, and produces the equivalent in Standard Language. As more of the language is compared, the translation becomes more precise. For instance, the word "Uhg" might be translated as "Hi" or "Hello" but later is interpreted as "Hey, baby. Lets get together and compare notes on the mating rituals in our respective sectors of the galaxy."

Universal Translators were used on a large scale at first; then on a ship-wide basis as most communications came from the ship. As the need arose for landing parties to contact previously unknown races and species, hand held models were issued as standard equipment on away teams. By the time of Star Trek: The Next Generation, the Universal Translator was intergrated into each personal communicator pin, so that each crew member or guest would have instantaneous use of its translating abilities.

The Kelly Communicator Pin also has a Universal Translator installed, and several improvements are being contemplated. For instance, when a crewmember asks, "What do I need to do to get a rank advancement?" The automatic response will now be, "Go talk to your Department Chief!" For those crewmembers endowed with exceptional tongue maneuverability (you know who you are) a pause button will be installed and you will be forced to listen to propaganda about the advantages of a certain chain of hotels. Recently, a plot had been thwarted to replace certain translations with four-letter words, but we caught it before any embarassment ocured. As for the culprit, "That's one Vulcan that will be laughing out of the other side of his mouth."

As you can see, the invention of the Universal Translator has provided a means of letting peoples of all races, backgrounds and heritages work together in understanding and harmony to improve the universe for future generations.

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The emblem of ENTERPRISE is interpreted as follows:

The outer circle, using the Navy colors of blue and gold, encloses a gold outline "Big E", the traditional nickname of her predecessor, the renowned aircraft carrier of World War II, USS ENTERPRISE (CV-6). As the world's first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, USS ENTERPRISE (CVN-65) has adopted this nickname, confident that it is living up to the traditions of service and duty that the "Big E" symbolizes.

Over the upper left hand section of the outlined "E" is an overlay of the globe showing the western hemisphere, home waters for ENTERPRISE and the United States Navy.

In the lower right hand section of the "E", and covered by part of the golden outline, is another section of the globe, showing the eastern hemisphere, symbolizing that ENTERPRISE and her aircraft can cover any part of the world.

Emerging through the center of the "E" is an aircraft carrier with a nuclear emblem surrounding the island structure to indicate the nuclear capability and power that ENTERPRISE contains.

When commissioned on November 25, 1961, ENTERPRISE was designated as a "nuclear-powered attack aircraft carrier" and was assigned the hull number CVAN-65. To more accurately reflect ENTERPRISE's multi-mission capabilities, the "A" (for attack) was dropped on July 1, 1975, and the Big "E" became a "nuclear-powered aircraft carrier" with the hull number CVN-65.



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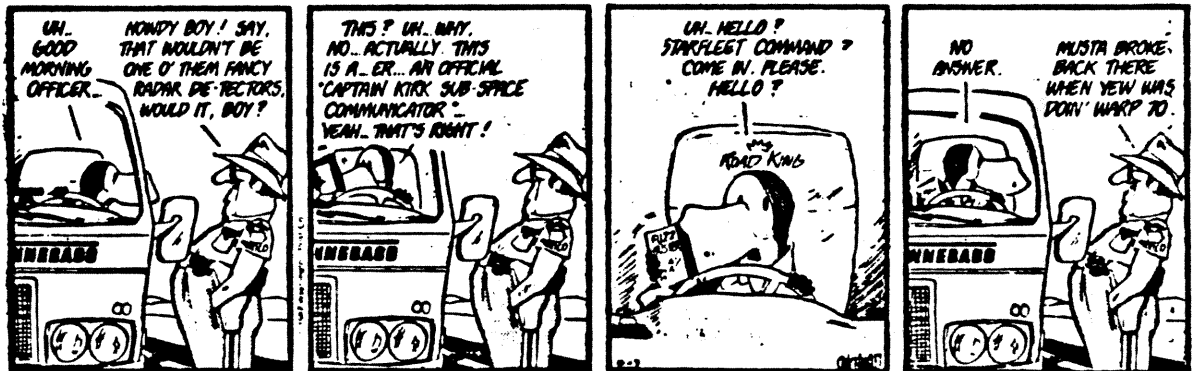

Klingon, the ultimate foreign language, goes academic

CHICAGO — The scene: A convention of one sort or another — linguists, say, or science fiction fans — in the not too distant future. With folks attending from all over the world, hundreds of tongues are represented, but there's still a communications problem. There doesn't seem to be one single language that everybody speaks.

"Well, that is, someone shouts 'No spitting on himself slightly as he boldly barks out the words — 'Yihngan Hol Dajath! ... (Do you speak Klingon?)'

Heads swivel; ears perk up all over the room, followed by a guttural cataphony as countless voices chorus: "Hissah! (Yes) Communications problem solved. Klingon spoken here."

"It sounds absurd," acknowledged Adger Lawrence M. Schoen, founder of the Klingon Language Institute and a man who enjoys devising the above scenario when he's not busy teaching psychology at Chestnut Hill College in Philadelphia. "But it could happen."

Sure, sure. Klingon is a tough-to-learn, totally made-up language spoken by gruff, tradition-daily warriorlike extraterrestrials from the fictitious Klingon Empire in the famous "Star Trek" films and TV's "Star Trek: The Next Generation." Klingon words are a disconcerting alphabet soup of upper case and lower case letters

and odd accent marks, and Klingon punctuation doesn't bother with question marks and exclamation points.

But it's also one of the hottest new languages in the universe, with more Terrans (the Klingon term for us Earthlings) tackling conversational Klingon every day, mastering useful phrases such as "Where is the bathroom?" "I have a headache," and "Stronder or die!"

"Right now, you're probably asking, 'Where can I learn this happening language?' No problem — or, as Klingons would say, "gay-be" (pronounced KYBE). Consider:

• The Klingon Language Institute (KLI), a Philadelphia-based group that includes a number of linguists as well as teen-age and college-age "Star Trek" fans is offering a free, 11-lesson correspondence course in Klingon. So far, more than 60 Terrans have signed up.

• *Star Trek: Conversational Klingon* (Simon & Schuster Audioworks, \$11), a new audiocassette featuring Michael Dorn (who plays resident Klingon Lt. Worf on "The Next Generation") and Klingon language creator Marc Okrand, is aimed at Terrans planning a visit to the Klingon Empire, home to many colorful customs. Von Hearn to recognize common Klingon phrases, including "check-out time 5:5 a.m." (recently heard when checking into a Klingon hotel) and "Hay or die" (uttered routinely by Klingon

shopkeepers).

• Several colleges or college-affiliated organizations offer or have offered non-credit courses in Klingon, including Chicago's Northwestern Illinois University, where an evening Klingon language lecture series is being presented by the Science Fiction Club.

"Klingons are very popular with 'Star Trek' fans, so I'm not surprised in their weird language," says Okrand, who created the harsh-sounding tongue for the 1984 film "Star Trek III: The Search for Spock" and authored *The Klingon Dictionary* (Pocket Books, \$10), recently published in a revised and expanded version.

"What is surprising to me is that people are actually studying it," Near-fanatical interest in "Star Trek" and Klingon culture is nothing new, of course. Devoted fans — many decked out as Klingons or other "Star Trek" characters — have been holding conventions for years. It's only recently, though, that the concept of actually speaking and writing Klingon has begun to gather steam and intrigue serious linguists as well as dedicated Trekkers.

Schoen, for example, grew up watching the original "Star Trek" shows, but notes that he was "a fan, not a fanatic. I never owned a pair of pointy rubber Vulcan ears or went to 'Star Trek' conventions."

Schoen, 33, a former professor at Lake Forest College in suburban Lake Forest, initially started studying Klingon a year ago to take his mind off the looming threat of unemployment.

"The college was having budget problems, and my position was being cut," says Schoen. "I wanted something to distract me while I was waiting to hear about another job, and I came across a copy of *The Klingon Dictionary*. My academic specialty is psycholinguistics, which deals with how we think about language, and I wondered if there were people who were actually studying Klingon the way people study the fictitious languages spoken by mythical races of elves in J.R.R. Tolkien's *Lord of the Rings*."

Using computer electronic bulletin boards, Schoen began searching for people interested in speaking the extraterrestrial tongue and was surprised at the large response. After hearing from scores of people eager to chat in Klingon, he founded the Klingon Language Institute and began publishing a quarterly ac-

counts journal called *HolQeD* (from the Klingon "Hol," which means language, and "QeD," science).

"I started out as a whimsical project, but there seemed to be a real demand for it," he explains. The journal, a non-profit, all-volunteer operation, generally takes a scholarly approach, but it also features jokes, puns and even an occasional contest. (A recent competition challenged subscribers to come up with a Klingon palindrome, a word or phrase spelled the same way backwards or forwards.)

"We have to remind ourselves not to take all this too seriously," says Schoen.

Now based in Flourtown, Pa., a suburb of Philadelphia, KLI — which celebrates its first anniversary this month — boasts more than 200 members, who pay \$5 annually (\$15 if they wish to also receive *HolQeD*). Many KLI members, Schoen notes, also belong to "Star Trek" and/or Klingon fan clubs.

"We're trying to bring in more academics, but we also want to appeal to a wide audience," he says. "As an educator, I think this is a great avenue for sneaking in education. People learn best when they learn something that is of interest to them. We have a number of teen-age members, for example — maybe we'll turn some of them into linguists."

A word of warning: Klingon is a tough language to learn (and a somewhat messy one, given the preponderance of guttural sounds). Schoen doesn't claim to be fluent.

Neither does Jeremy Cowan, a KLI member and "Next Generation" fan who teaches a non-credit lecture course in the Klingon language at Northeastern Illinois University.

According to Cowan, the course — which is open to the public — has attracted the occasional linguistics professor along with die-hard "Star Trek" fans and curious students.

"I love playing around with languages," says Cowan. "My friends and I exchange little quips in Klingon here and there, but I would like to find more people to chat with so that I could become more fluent."

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Be Rude and Crude: It's the Klingon Way

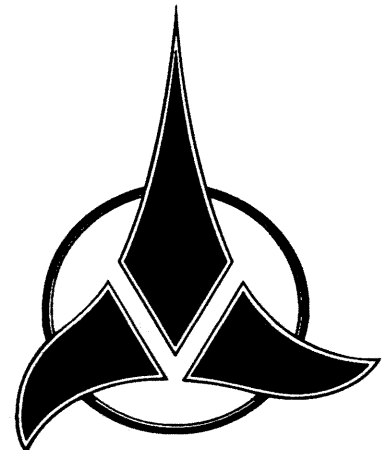

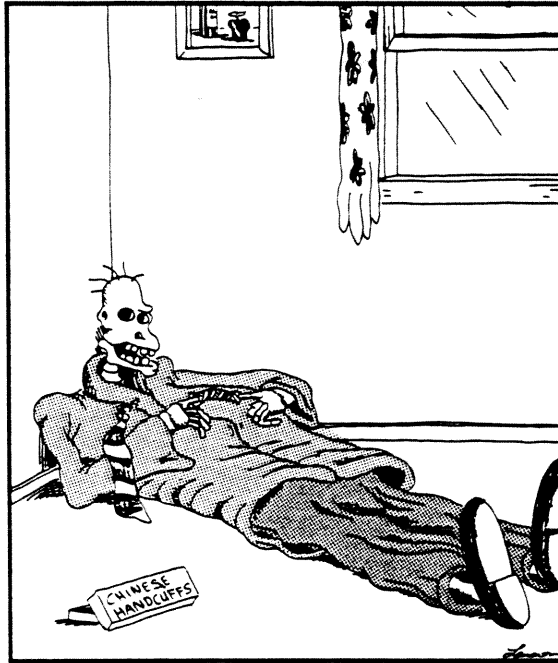

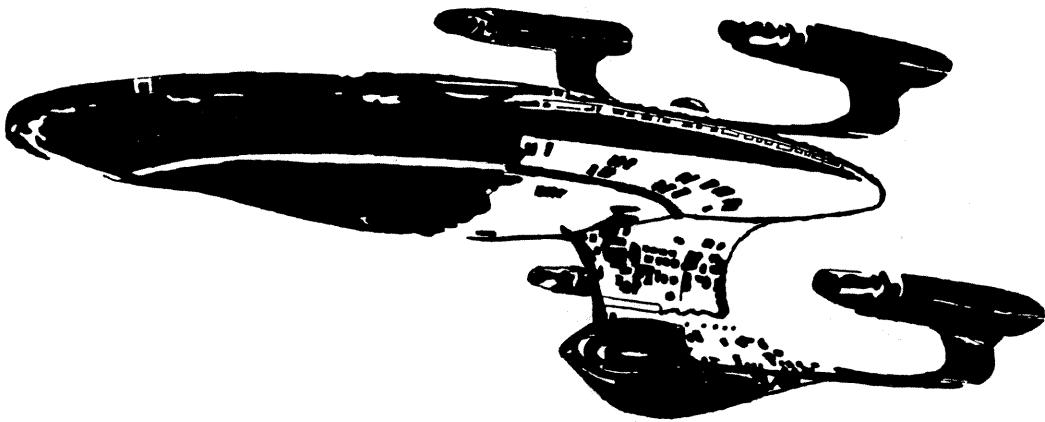
