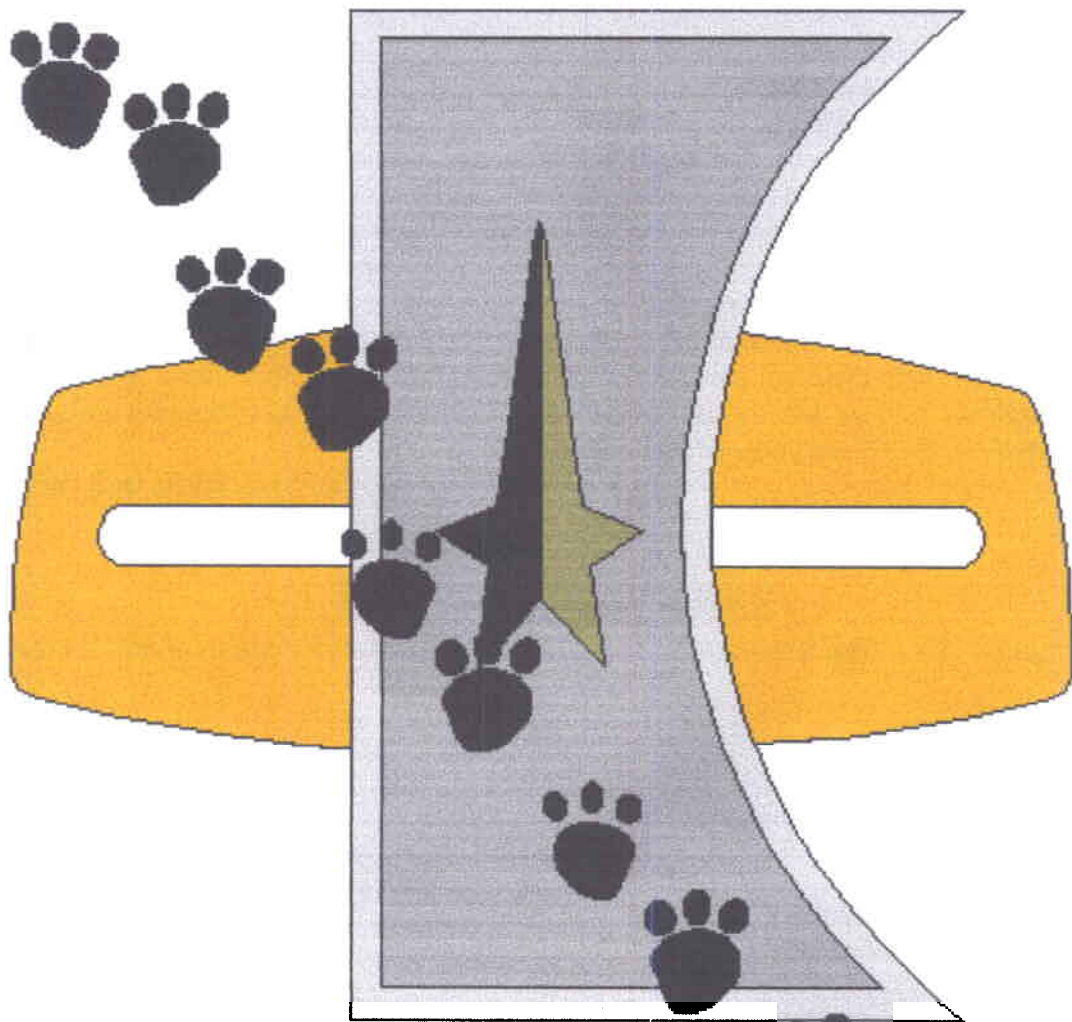

Holograms & Photonic Rights

There has been much discussion of late about the rights of "photonic beings". What rights do they have & should they have?

This discussion must be limited to artificial photonic beings-a.k.a. holograms. We can assume that naturally-occurring photonic beings would be automatically considered life forms & treated accordingly. However holograms, like androids, are created beings and their complexity is determined by programming, not biology. The issues are not dissimilar to those faced by Lt. Cmdr Data.

In 2365 a hologram of the Sherlock Holmes character "Professor Moriarty" was inadvertently made sentient on the holodeck of the U.S.S. Enterprise D. Moriarty's basic matrix had been pre-programmed with the character traits assigned him by the original author of the Holmes stories, Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. The programming that was later added by accident allowed the character to become fully developed and aware of his artificial nature; but the basic programming was still in place. He was able to manipulate the computer systems of the Enterprise and take over the ship. Moriarty wished to be free of the holodeck and used ruthless methods to get the Enterprise crew to help him.

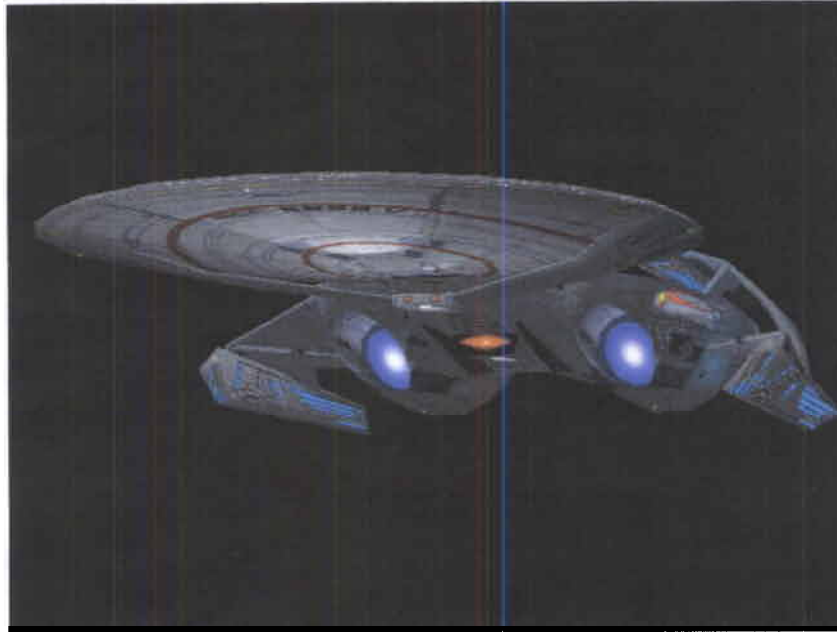
Other holodeck characters have been programmed in such detail as to be able to freely interact with biological beings. These characters have no significant differences from non-artificial people except that (in most cases) they are not aware that they are artificial. An excellent example of this level of interaction is found among the inhabitants of Fairhaven-a hologram developed on U.S.S. Voyager.

However, those holograms who have "complete" personalities and are aware they are holograms are the center of the photonic rights controversy. It is argued that Vic Fontaine, Voyager's EMH and similar entities are life forms and should be treated as such. The opposing arguments rely on the artificial nature of these characters.

Aboard the U.S.S. Kelly the Command Staff has taken the position that sufficiently developed holograms should be treated identically with non-artificial crew members. We have 2 holograms that run full time-Andy Eng, the Emergency Engineering Hologram (EEH), and Dr. Ruth Bug, a copy of the EMH from the U.S.S. Retributor. Dr. Ruth has replaced the standard EMH aboard the Kelly. Both have control of their matrices and have the run of the ship-subject to the placement of holoemitters. Outside sickbay, engineering and the holodecks, they cannot be in the same room, and in some areas of the ship lack can only be projected without the ability to have solid form. Their movements may be additionally restricted during times when extra power is needed for critical ship's systems. Nevertheless, they have full lives and participate in a wide variety of professional duties and social activities.

The final word on photonic rights has yet to be spoken, however it seems likely, given popular opinion and the broad policies of Star Fleet, as well as the similarities to the established case law on android rights, that holograms will be legally accepted as sentient life forms, provided the hologram is sufficiently advanced. Presumably "ordinary" holograms will continue to be used in holoprograms the same way "live" actors are used. We can also assume that we will see more of these sophisticated holograms take their places in our biological society.

YAMATO CLASS EXPERIMENTAL BATTLESHIP



U.S.S. Yamato NX-5628

Armed with two massive Assault Phasers, each capable of cracking the shields of a Starbase or Battlestation, this is the most heavily armed, and powered, Federation ship ever constructed. During initial testing of the assault phasers, it was recommended that the Yamato-class receive a second warp core to power the assault phasers only. This recommendation was put into effect and, as of June 2391, the Yamato-class Experimental Battleships have two warp cores. The Yamato-class is also one of the most interesting designs present in the Federation fleet. She has a titanic saucer and two (comparatively) diminutive secondary hulls which are attached to the underside of the saucer. Suspended between these two secondary hulls is the assault phaser mount. One of the breakthroughs concerning this assault phaser design is that it is connected to both warp cores, allowing the single phaser to act like two and fire a second time using the second core's power output. The assault phaser is cooled by exposing some of the critical parts to the vacuum of space. Thus, while allowing for extremely fast cooling of the phaser after firing, the assault phaser is easily damaged once her shields have been breached. But, with shields comparable to small bases, most captains have nothing really to worry about. This design does have its share of failings though. The few captains lucky enough to command these ships have complained how, during simulations, marauding Klingon ships have easily dodged the main fore weapons arrays and concentrated their fire on the port and starboard arcs, rarely straying into the aft arc, and never passing in front of this formidable behemoth's main weapons systems, thus making her assault phaser nearly useless against smaller ships. Larger ships, however, should be warned not to stray into this formidable battleship's forward arc because of that very phaser. While it is very inaccurate, it still can hit a target of a cruiser size or above if it has a good shot. To remedy this problem, Starfleet's Design Bureau has petitioned a QCB projector to be added to her standard weaponry. Unfortunately, this petition has not met with results and is still being considered.
