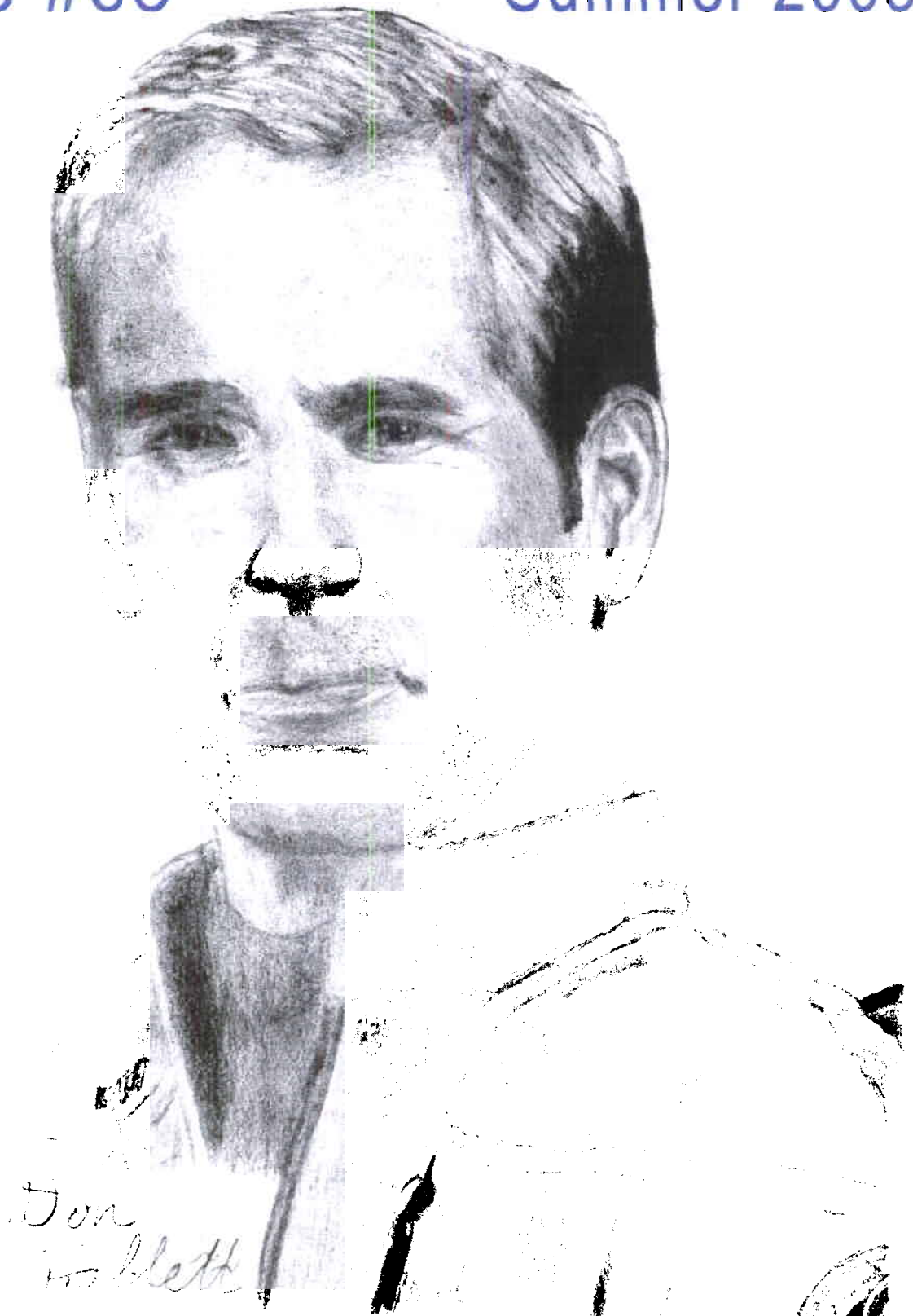

My name is Richard Henline and I am the captain of the U.S.S. KELLY. My Executive Officer forwarded your email to me and asked if I could answer your questions about our ship and club. First, I would like to tell you a little bit about our organization, then I will explain how we came up with the name of Kelly. We are a Star Trek club that was brought together because of our common interest in a television show that portrayed a positive future. Yes, we enjoy watching the program but we do not stop there. We are a group of diverse individuals, with many different backgrounds, occupations and beliefs. We are bound together in common cause to build a better world around us. Making new friends, celebrating life, improving ourselves and uplifting each other are our goals. One of our major focuses is on charity. We support the stamp project to benefit the children of India and Nepal. We have also been involved with seeking a cure for Batters Disease (from which one of our crew died), Working for Babies with Aids, the American Diabetes Association and others. We support Community Action projects, such as cleaning up parks and highways, befriending troubled teens groups, working to improve the homeless shelter and donating blood at the bi-annual Robert A. Heinlein Memorial Blood Drive. We believe that the world can be a better place if people are willing to work to make it so.

Our club is based on a hypothetical Starship from the Star Trek universe and we all occupy various positions onboard. Most Starships are named after famous real life water vessels, so when we started the club we began researching to find a worthy ship after which to name our own vessel. As we studied the records of the HMS Kelly, we were impressed with her integrity and dedication, qualities we were hoping for in our club. Further, we noted several similarities between your ship and ours. First, I am a distant relative of Lord Captain Mountbatten (I believe it is an 11th or 12th cousin connection). Both Captains went on to become Fleet Admirals. There were a lot of other things that we had in common, so there was no doubt of what to name our ship. We like to let everyone know about the proud history and tradition of the HMS Kelly and her fine crew. We have a saying on our ship, based on a quote from Star Trek, "Let history never forget the name KELLY."

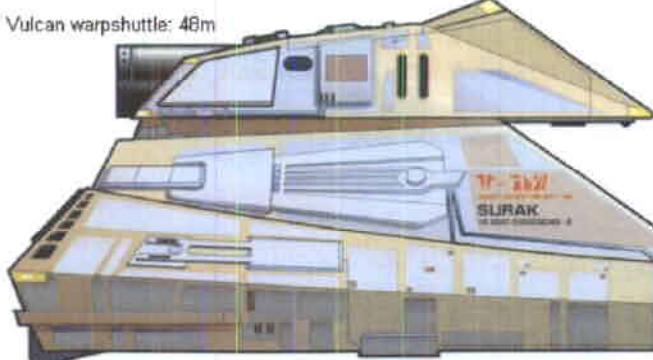
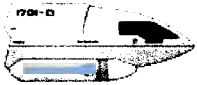
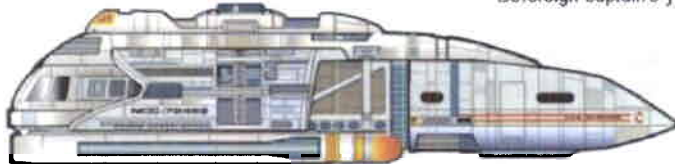
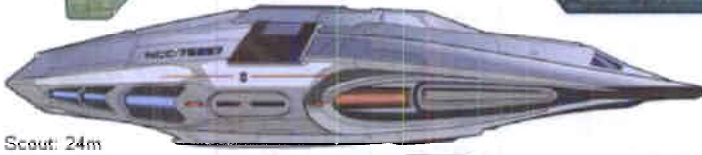
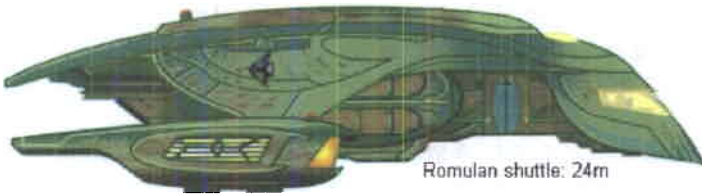

CONduit 13: Nightmare or Pleasant Dream?

Since my personal schedule for the summer includes a Family trip to Las Vegas in 2 weeks, I skipped the Fleet Campout & attended Conduit 13: The Nightmare Continues. I preface my report with two comments: 1) It was nice to not be responsible for anything & thus attend whatever panels I wanted. 2) Appearances can be deceiving: despite an *apparently* uninteresting lineup of panels on the schedule; the ones I went to (with two exceptions) were enjoyable. If anyone's interest is exclusively Star Trek; they might be better off staying home 3 out of 4 years. If they can also include Star Wars, space travel, and J.R.R. Tolkien they will be entertained every year. This does not even include costumes, anime, gaming, recent or upcoming movies, or funny songs (yes, I mean FILK).

I attended 2 panels on Tolkien. The principle panelist was a professor from Purdue University who has made the study of Tolkien his life's work. There is a lot more to his writing than is apparent on the surface. Did you know that clothing color has significance? Did you know that the ways rune branches point have significance beyond indicating a letter? Why is Tom Bombadil included in The Lord of the Rings & was it wrong to cut him from the movie? This and much more was discussed in an all-too-brief two hours. Tolkien once stated that the reason artificial languages (i.e. Esperanto) fail to catch on is that there are no stories to tell in those languages. Tolkien created his languages first then used them to tell his stories. Compare this to Klingon. It is also an artificial language, but it had a culture behind it to begin with. This culture was further developed as the language developed. Language first—then stories.

If you were walking the streets of Coruscant would you be able to tell a Wookiee from a Bothan, from a Hoojib, or an Ewok?". Rebels Associated taught us the differences.

What happens when advanced technology ["magic"] shows up on the battlefield? Harry Turtledove, author of numerous alternate history stories told us in his panel: "When the Witch Doctor Goes to War".

Just how big IS space, and how does one get around when they get there? Author James VanPelt had the answer in "Space Travel For Beginners"

Do you just want to sit around & talk about Enterprise? CONduit was the place Sunday afternoon.

Only in May in Salt Lake City can Filkers, Costumers, Knights, Fairies, Anime Characters, Wookies, Rebels, Vampires, Artists, Musicians, Writers, Modelers, Poets, Chocoholics, and other assorted creatures gather together in (relative) harmony. The Fleet was missed for their company as well as their creative presentations, but the convention survived, and perhaps a few (like me) tried something new this year, and hopefully liked it.

Other highlights were the Klingon Jail & Bail by IKV L'Chon, and Don Hallett surrendering his CONduit Mascot title at the Ice Cream Social. Lee Cheer Bear swept the Hall Costume contest, but was denied Best Costume award on the technicality of being a stuffed bear & not a living creature.

Q. How many Klingons does it take to change a light bulb?
A. None. Klingons aren't afraid of the dark.

May 1940. The *Kelly* was taken to dry docks for repairs and was welcomed with open arms from the shipbuilders. Only her splendid design and workmanship saved her from being split in two from the torpedo. Thousands of people came to pay tribute to her and a tablet was placed at the cemetery to commemorate the men who died on her in battle.

Repairs this time were a big job. She needed a new stern, bow, midships, etc. The torpedo had torn the guts out of the ship. The Captain and staff moved to other ships aboard the *Jackal*, *Jupiter*, *Javelin* and other ships. During these months of repairs Britain reached a crisis in the war and showed her "finest hour." Between Hitler's first attack on May 10th and the Battle of Britain the destroyers suffered the most.

Then came the emergency evacuation of British soldiers on the shores of Dunkirk in France. Surrounded on all sides by the Nazis and being attacked from above by air, the British government asked all able vessels to leave Britain and cross the channel to rescue the soldiers. The rescue took 8 days. 9 destroyers were sunk and 23 were badly damaged. Then the Luftwaffe began the blitzkrieg, or bombing of southern England. When the *Kelly* was ready for sea, the war had changed. Because of the fall of France, her job would be more difficult. Germany now had the use of the whole Atlantic coast of Europe to operate submarines, ships and aircraft. A strong force of E-boats attacked from the channel. British shipping was rerouted through Scotland and Northern Ireland. The most dangerous waters were the East Coast and the Thames.

The Mediterranean also became a theater of war. Italy's attitude towards Britain changed from neutral to hostile and the British fleet in the Mediterranean needed to be reinforced. On July 10th Italy declared war on Britain and the French fleet were taken by the Germans. On October 28th Italy invaded Greece. By November the first men came to Hebburn to check in with the new *Kelly* and at the beginning of December the *Kelly* steamed out of the port.

The word for recruits was "*Kelly*?" Oh, you want to steer clear of her, mate-she's always in trouble, she is. You might get a medal, and on the other hand you might be digging a hole in the 'ogwash." Half an hour after Captain Mountbatten put up the notice for volunteers, the line stretched halfway across the drill shed and back again. The ranks of the "regulars" was almost depleted so the rating "Hostilities Only" was created. These men had to be trained quickly to be sailors. One sailor told his mother he was assigned the *Kelly* and she replied, "Oh, I am relieved. He's the first cousin to the King, and those people are never allowed to take any chances." Little did she know Mountbatten! Mountbatten arrived in port on the *Javelin*, or what was left of her, with the stern and bow shot off. He was anxious to be on the *Kelly*.

The newspaper *Daily Mirror* wrote this article: "Torpedo, Bombs, Fog and Storm - British Grit in a British Ship Beat the Lot. Lord Louis Mountbatten, cousin of the King, refused to abandon and sink his ship, *H.M.S. Kelly*, when she was crippled by a German torpedo off the enemy coast. Instead, he and his crew, fighting with the faith and fire of Nelson, used the destroyer as a floating fence to sink a hunted Nazi torpedo-boat - then defied enemy bombing attacks for three days and made port safely. But today, *Kelly*, her wounds healed after seven months, is an active service again waiting for the Germans to come out and fight..."

The *Kelly*'s First Lieutenant was Lord High Beresford, the third son of the Marquess of Waterford and the nephew of Admiral Lord Charles Beresford who had commanded the Mediterranean 35 years earlier. Beresford saw the war as a conflict of right against wrong and it was his duty to defend his King and Country. He was a quiet, shy man but like Mountbatten, he was well liked. Next to the Captain, this was the man to whom they would entrust their lives.

yIDoghQo'! Klingon Interpreter Sought to Work With Mentally Ill

PORTLAND, Ore. — Position Available: Interpreter, must be fluent in Klingon.

The language created for the "Star Trek" TV series and movies is one of about 55 needed by the office that treats mental health patients in metropolitan Multnomah County.

"We have to provide information in all the languages our clients speak," said Jerry Jelusich, a procurement specialist for the county Department of Human Services, which serves about 60,000 mental health clients.

Although created for works of fiction, Klingon was designed to have a consistent grammar, syntax and

vocabulary.

And now Multnomah County research has found that many people — and not just fans — consider it a complete language.

"There are some cases where we've had mental health patients where this was all they would speak," said the county's purchasing administrator, Franna Hathaway.

County officials said that obligates them to respond with a Klingon-English interpreter, putting the language of starship Enterprise officer Worf and other Klingon characters on a par with common languages such as Russian and Vietnamese, and less common tongues, including Dari and Tongan.

UNITED STATES

Officials in Oregon decide that Klingon idea was too . . . spacey

PORTLAND, Ore. — Sorry, potential Klingon interpreters.

Officials have said they won't be needing your services after all.

The office that treats mental health patients in Multnomah County had included Klingon on a list of 55 languages that could be spoken by incoming patients.

But the inclusion of the Star Trek language drew a spate of tongue-in-cheek headlines.

And now the county has rescinded its call, stressing that it hasn't spent a penny of public money on Klingon interpretation.

"It was a mistake, and a result of an overzealous attempt to ensure that our safety net systems can respond to all customers and clients," Multnomah County chair Diane Linn said in a news release.
